- HB35 SB286 Prohibiting a person from buying or offering to buy a minor for money, property, or anything else of value; establishing that specified penalties apply to a violation of the Act; establishing that a person who violates the Act is subject to a provision of law that authorizes the State to institute a prosecution for the offense at any time; etc.

- Authorizing a county, municipality, or other public body that has the authority to enact laws and adopt local police regulations relating to traffic to decrease a maximum speed limit in a business district or a residential district to not less than 25 miles an hour without conducting an engineering and traffic investigation.

- Altering the computation of a retirement allowance for members or former members of the Judges' Retirement System who have 10 years of service credit and retire on disability under specified circumstances.

- Establishing the Maryland Bottled Gas Buying Group as a nonprofit public corporation to negotiate the lowest-cost supply of bottled gas on behalf of its members; specifying the intent of the General Assembly that the Buying Group become fiscally self-sustaining; establishing a Board of Directors of the Buying Group; establishing a Maryland Bottled Gas Buying Group Fund; etc.

- Requiring specified carriers that offer specified out-of-state association contracts to Maryland residents also to offer specified individual health insurance contracts to Maryland residents; requiring the carriers to make specified disclosures to a Maryland resident applying for coverage under an out-of-state association contract; etc.

- Adding a new title to the State Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, to be designated and known as "Title 20. Human Relations"; revising, restating, and recodifying laws relating to the Commission on Human Relations; revising, restating, and recodifying laws relating to various forms of discrimination and relating to enforcement of discrimination laws; etc.

- Correcting cross-references to Article 49B (Human Relations Commission) in the Annotated Code of Maryland; and making technical and stylistic changes.

- HB56 Authorizing a court, when placing on probation a defendant who has been convicted of a specified crime of domestic violence, to order the defendant to carry or wear a global positioning system device as a condition of probation and to provide the victim of the crime with an electronic receptor device capable of receiving specified information that notifies the victim of the defendant's proximity to the victim; etc.
- HB57 Requiring the Department of Human Resources to refer an individual to family planning counseling and services when the individual is identified as responsible for child abuse or neglect in a central registry of child abuse and neglect cases or when the parental rights of the individual are terminated involuntarily due to child abuse or neglect.
- HB58 SB107 Providing that in Anne Arundel County or the City of Annapolis, an establishment licensed for alcoholic beverages with an on-sale privilege that is open on Inauguration Day may remain open for 1 hour past its normal closing time for consumption on the premises only, on payment of a \$200 fee to the Anne Arundel County Board of License Commissioners or the City of Annapolis Alcohol Beverage Control Board, as appropriate; and making the Act an emergency measure.
- HB59 SB117 Continuing the State Board of Well Drillers in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (sunset law) by extending to July 1, 2021, the termination provisions relating to the statutory and regulatory authority of the Board; requiring that an evaluation of the Board be performed on or before July 1, 2020; and requiring the Board to make a specified report on or before October 1, 2009.

- Extending to July 1, 2014, the date on which the Maryland Horse Racing Act terminates; requiring that an evaluation of the State Racing Commission and specified advisory committees be performed on or before July 1, 2013; and exempting the Commission and specified advisory committees from specified evaluation requirements.
- HB60 SB119 Continuing the State Athletic Commission in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (sunset law) by extending to July 1, 2021, the termination provisions relating to the statutory and regulatory authority of the Commission; requiring that an evaluation of the Commission be performed on or before July 1, 2020; and requiring the Commission to make a specified report on or before October 1, 2013.
- HB61 SB118 Continuing the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (sunset law) by extending to July 1, 2021, the termination provisions relating to the statutory and regulatory authority of the Board; requiring that an evaluation of the Board be performed on or before July 1, 2020; and requiring the Board to make a specified report on or before October 1, 2009.
- HB62 SB116 Altering the deadline for withdrawing a certificate of candidacy to coincide with the deadline for filing a certificate of candidacy.
- HB63 Clarifying that a specified type of continuing education instruction performed under specified circumstances is not covered employment for purposes of unemployment insurance.
- HB64 Adding Worcester County to the list of counties in which specified nonprofit fraternal, religious, and war veterans' organizations may own and operate not more than five slot machines under specified circumstances.
- HB65 (1) A person convicted of theft of property or services with a value of: (I) AT LEAST \$500 [or more] BUT LESS THAN \$10,000 is guilty of a felony and: [(i)] 1. is subject to imprisonment not exceeding [15] 10 years or a fine not exceeding [\$25,000] \$10,000 or both; and [(ii)] 2. shall restore the property taken to the owner or pay the owner the value of the property or services; OR (II) \$10,000 OR MORE IS GUILTY OF A FELONY AND: 1. IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 25 YEARS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$100,000 OR BOTH; AND 2. SHALL RESTORE THE PROPERTY TAKEN TO THE OWNER OR PAY THE OWNER THE VALUE OF THE PROPERTY OR SERVICES.
- HB66 Prohibiting a person from moving a vehicle right or left on a roadway in order to change lanes unless the person gives an appropriate signal in a specified manner; making stylistic changes; etc.
- HB67 Increasing the amount allowed as a deduction for additional exemptions under the Maryland income tax for individuals who, as of the last day of the taxable year, are blind or are at least 65 years old, from \$1,000 to \$3,200 for tax years 2009 and beyond; making the additional exemption amounts subject to specified reductions based on the federal adjusted gross income of the individual; applying the Act to tax years beginning after December 31, 2008; etc.

- Repealing a specified provision of law that prohibits a specified licensee from receiving more than a specified number of continuing education credit hours to meet continuing education requirements if the credit hours are obtained by home study or service as a teacher, lecturer, or discussion leader.
- HB69 SB128 Repealing provisions establishing the Community Services Advisory Commission; repealing the reporting requirement for the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene regarding the Substance Abuse Treatment Outcomes Partnership Fund; repealing the reporting requirement for the State Advisory Council on Arthritis and Related Diseases; repealing the reporting requirement for the Maryland Medical Advisory Committee; repealing the community choice program; etc.
- HB70 Making a technical change to conform the law regarding the appointment of managers within the Office of Policy Analysis to current practice.
- HB71 Prohibiting a person from using a text messaging device to write, send, or read a text message while operating a motor vehicle.
- HB72 Establishing the Floating Teacher Pilot Program in Baltimore City and in Montgomery and Prince George's Counties; requiring specified boards of education to select three underperforming schools to participate in the Pilot Program; requiring the State Department of Education to reimburse specified boards for the cost of implementing the Program; requiring the Department to report on the effectiveness of the Floating Teacher Pilot Program by December 31, 2011; etc
- HB73 Providing that a grantee that obtains title to a condominium unit or to a lot in a homeowners association in a foreclosure sale is jointly and severally liable with the unit owner or the lot owner for up to 6 months of assessments under a lien imposed for assessments due; authorizing the governing body of a homeowners association to impose a lien under the Maryland Contract Lien Act to enforce the payment of assessments and charges due; etc.
- HB74 Prohibiting the Board of Directors of the Maryland Health Insurance Plan from applying a preexisting condition limitation on Plan coverage; repealing the authority of the Board to offer members an optional endorsement to remove a preexisting condition limitation; and repealing a provision prohibiting the Plan from applying a preexisting condition exclusion to a specified individual who applies for coverage under the Plan within a specified time period.

- HB76 Repealing the termination date for a provision of law that requires the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to conduct specified outreach and public awareness campaigns regarding the hepatitis C virus.

- HB77 Allowing a retail gasoline dealer against whom a complaint is filed alleging a violation of the below-cost sales law to produce documents relating to the complaint within a 3-day period; providing for the imposition of sanctions in a specified manner, including a civil penalty; and making a stylistic change. Repealing provisions of law that prohibit a retail service station dealer from selling motor fuel below cost; repealing specified provisions of law that require the Comptroller, on receipt of a complaint, to conduct a specified investigation within a specified amount of time; repealing penalties; and repealing the exemption for motor fuel sold by a retail service station dealer from the provisions of the Sales Below
- HB78 Cost Act. Expanding the scope of the Maryland Mortgage Fraud Protection Act to prohibit the creation or production of a document that contains a deliberate misstatement, misrepresentation, or omission with the intent that the document be relied on by a mortgage lender, borrower, or any other party to the mortgage lending process.
- HB79 Authorizing the Frederick County Liquor Board to appoint not more than two part-time alcoholic beverages inspectors; specifying requirements that a person must meet to qualify for appointment; specifying the powers, duties, and compensation of part-time inspectors; and making specified prohibitions against conflict of interest applicable to part-time alcoholic beverages inspectors.
- HB80 SB608 Providing a State property tax exemption for property in Frederick County that is actively used for farm or agricultural purposes and is subject to an easement or other interest that is conveyed or assigned to specified entities; and applying the Act to tax years beginning after June 30, 2009.
- HB81 Altering the amount of the penalty imposed on water users in Frederick County for restoring service after an overdue charge for water and sewer services has been paid.
- HB82 SB607 Requiring a pharmacy to display a SMARxT Disposal Campaign poster containing information on the proper storage and disposal of prescription drugs.
- HB83 Requiring the Governor to proclaim annually the second Saturday in May as Negro Baseball League
- HB84 SB248 Day. Requiring public institutions of higher education in the State, with one exception, to develop and implement campaigns, processes, practices, and procedures relating to college textbooks and supplemental material regarding content revisions, availability, and cost; requiring publishers of college textbooks to disclose specified information to faculty, textbook adopting entities, or institution
- HB85 SB183 administrations; etc.

- Requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to adopt regulations that establish a process for entities that are defined as "excluded organizations" under the food establishments law to choose whether they submit to specified regulation or licensure; and requiring, rather than authorizing, the Department to adopt regulations that establish a voluntary licensing system for excluded organizations under the food establishments law.
- HB86 SB131 Decreasing the number of days per month that an inmate serving a term of confinement that includes a consecutive or concurrent sentence for a crime of possession of a regulated firearm by a specified person prohibited from possessing a regulated firearm is allowed as a deduction in advance from the inmate's term of confinement; etc.
- HB87 SB182 Prohibiting a District Court commissioner from authorizing the pretrial release of a defendant charged with a specified offense involving a firearm if the defendant has previously been convicted of a specified offense involving a firearm; providing that a judge may authorize the pretrial release of a specified defendant on specified conditions; requiring a judge to order the continued detention of a specified defendant under specified circumstances; etc.
